
Instructions:

- 1. The value assigned to a course, usually based on the number of hours of class contact hours per week per semester.
- **2.** Part of the money students must pay toward attending college.
- 3: An outline of the topics that will be covered by the course instructor, and usually includes the list of assignments to be completed and their due dates.
- **5.** A 4-year degree that is granted for completion of a course of study usually requiring 120-128 semester credits.
- 6. Post-secondary work-based learning in which a partnership is established between the schools, the employer or business, and the student for the purpose of providing practical education to the student through productive work opportunities.
- 7. Is used for the purpose of higher or secondary education. They usually have a low interest rate and repayment is not required until a given amount of time after graduation.
- 8. A form of financial assistance that is usually given by the government and it does not have to be paid back.
- **10.** A course taken by choice, as distinguished from a course specifically required by a degree.
